Write that note to Aunt Lucy thanking her for the lovely reindeer antler candleholder she sent you for Christmas. Handwritten notes are treasured keepsakes for some. Recognize the guy who corrals the grocery carts in the rain. If he brings them in, they won't be scratching your car. Give your letter carrier some fresh baked cookies to show how much you appreciate him/her. A kind word said to anyone in a service industry position shows gratitude. You have the power to brighten someone's day.

This year I hope you'll join me in shelving the Three C's: Complaining, Condemning, and Criticizing and embracing the Three A's: Accept, Acknowledge,

and Appreciate. Let me start 2008 by practicing what I'm preaching. I *accept* you for who you are and think you are amazing. I *acknowledge* that each of you is unique and wonderfully made. ### Gilbert's Box

This story began shortly after I became a clown. It doesn't take long when you are a "first of May" to realize that as a clown that is ready for anything, one must have a lot of "toys" available to use during a long event. I tried using my pockets, but I looked like a squirrel packing away nuts for the winter. I also felt like a pack mule. No matter how many pockets I had, it was never enough. Faced with this dilemma, I kept my "clown eyes" open for a solution. One day while visiting my parents, I discovered a box in their garage. My Dad was a collector of anything and everything. We (his family) thought much of it was junk, but Dad, who grew up during the depression of the thirties, saw value in everything, so Dad saved "stuff." This box was of sound construction, not too big, not too small, and like the three bears, it was "just right." The box was ugly, the finish was gone, and it was dirty and full of stuff but in my clown eyes it was just what I had been looking for. After cleaning and a coat of red paint, it looked pretty good; perfect for what I had in mind. At that time, and still today now that I think about it, I spend way too much time thinking about what I could, what I should, and what I do as a clown. After much thought I decided the box should serve more than one purpose. I could use it as a prop, or make it part of my act as it were. What to do? What to do? I got it!! I'll have snakes jump out of the box every time I get another prop for the next bit or trick. I thought up a story of how I borrowed this box (without asking) from my good friend Gilbert (a good name for a clown's friend and one I could remember without thinking.) On the bottom of the box, the part the kids see when I put the box on a stand, I painted DO NOT OPEN.

Now the story I would tell the kids was that I knew I had to do a show for them and I had to have cool tricks and games, right. Well, my friend Gilbert has WAY cool games and tricks so I went over to his house to see what I could borrow. He wasn't home but I found his box and I "borrowed" it without asking. You shouldn't borrow anyone's stuff without asking...that's stealing. Gilbert has booby-trapped his box to keep others (in this case me) out of it. That explains why the snakes jump out. Now-how to blow it off? Got it! I had recently bought a rat trap that had been rigged to allow you to put your fingers under the bail giving the illusion that you had been caught in the trap. This trap also has a cap from a cap pistol on it to produce the bang of the trap going off. So now after opening Gilbert's box several times and having spring snakes jump out and scaring me, I get SMART and only open the box

slightly slipping my hand through the crack...Ka Pow!!!!. I jerk my hand out with the rat trap attached to it reacting in great pain, hopping around until I can get the trap off. Then, I tell the kids the moral of the running gag...that it is not a good idea to borrow things without asking because in the end you will be sorry. I thought this would be perfect to entertain and teach them something at the same time. What could be better than that? Well it did work out great until that one time...here's what happened...

I had a job entertaining a group of kids at a "mission" at an apartment complex for residents of modest income, hosted by a large church in the metro-plex. I had conned, or asked my friend, Dubble Bubble, into going along as I lacked the confidence to do the job by myself. Plus more clowns equal more fun in my book. The lady asked us if we could take the kids to a room away from the revival portion of the event thinking the kids would be bored and become a distraction. We were basically trapped in the Manager's office with a bunch of kids so we think, "perfect time for a show." Now Dubble Bubble and I had not worked together very much at that time. So we decided I would do something then she would do something then we would do something together and would alternate that way until (a) we ran out of things to do, or (b) we thought of something better to do or, (c) someone came and got us.

I thought this would be perfect time to use my Gilbert's box "bit." It had worked in the past, even though I was still fine tuning it. I believed it would be a good addition to the show. The kids were of varied ages so we did things appropriate to older as well as younger children.

When we were not performing, we would take turns sitting on the floor with the rest of the audience. My memories of the specifics of the show are vague. I think we got the reactions we hoped for, and I wasn't disappointed with the show we gave them. It was only after the show that Dubble Bubble relayed a comment made by a little girl of three or four. At the end of my running gag, while I was hopping around with the rat-trap "attached" to my hand, this innocent little girl (with a frightened look on her face) said, "I hate it when the rats come out."

I felt horrible; I still do, to think I caused an unpleasant memory to surface in this girl's mind. It is exactly the opposite effect I was after. I was hoping to make them forget at least for a while all the unpleasantness of their lives. I wanted to go back and tell her everything would be all right and give her a hug to make up for my insensitivity. I couldn't because I wasn't sure which girl had made the statement. Sometimes our innocent actions are received in a manner which we have no control or no way of knowing. That was the last time I used my rat-trap; I, like the little girl, don't think it is funny anymore.

### Perspective

Perspective: According to the current definition in the FUNK & Wagnells, Book of Words, perspective means, "The ability to perceive things in their actual interrelations or comparative importance: A mental view or outlook."

So many attitudes...so little time. Most often we hear of only the bad or negative attitudes, and not nearly enough of the positive or good attitudes. Over the years, I've been blessed by many, many lives that have touched mine. Some of the encounters have been brief and others will last a lifetime. Some of the lifetimes have been brief, and there have been so many. My heart and my life have been made stronger by the strengths of the families that have undergone the traumatic times of losing a precious child or of having a child with a devastating illness.

Whether sitting at the hospital or going on a Special Wish, these kids and families have a different perspective than most of us. They live for now, not tomorrow, not yet, just a little longer today. Some have a hope for recovery and a few cling to that hope till the end and then have the faith to accept the inevitable.

A friend of mine's family member had an attitude quite different from some of the other families I have been involved with. Their child had been ill for most of his life. The parents seemed to feel they were owed something by everyone they came in contact with. Needless to say, this was not a totally positive attitude.

Other families try to make it better for others. Recently, I met a very nice family who had started a 501C-3 Foundation after losing their son two years ago. The Foundation is the Hunter Crumpton Foundation. They fill a need in the community by fulfilling needs or wishes for children and their families. They cover anything from birthday parties to electric bills. The

Mom, Dad, and the surviving sister of Hunter were at peace and so full of love and support for the family they were celebrating the birthday for. The little boy was turning 5 and had been to Disney thru the Make a Wish Foundation the week before. They said he would probably not have another birthday and wanted to make this one extra special. Three of us clowns went to help make that happen. We face painted, made animal balloons, blew bubbles, and just clowned around in general.

The very same week, I spent an hour or so with another family probably celebrating their son's last birthday also. I think I was there for the other kids and the family members more than for him. He did not appear to see or hear but his parents acted as though everything was normal, so I did too.

The two events were extremely different and at the same time the same. One family was very wealthy and the other family, well, let's just say I don't think they knew where the next meal was coming from. One family had a home that was a minimansion and the other had recently moved in with relatives. Both families were very appreciative of my efforts to make the day a little more special. Both Moms and Dads were wonderful parents and really showed the love for their children.

So often, we become tied up in the moment and forget to "live in the moment." These families have learned to live in the moment and I hope to remember the lessons that I am learning from them. To keep my perspective on a higher level than the problems of the moment is definitely a challenge some days. The old saying of "Don't worry, be happy" sounds better and better.
