
Purpose of the Texas Clown Association

CONVENTION 2008 COMPETITION

Congratulations to all the competitors who participated in Wichita Falls. I know how intimidating it can be to perform for your peers. It is/was not an easy task conducting a competition of that size with a shorthanded staff. I want to complement the Host Alley on their efforts; it truly was an exceptional and memorable experience. The purpose of holding competition at the convention is one of instruction, it should be a learning experience for all. I know from being on all sides of the competition that if you pay attention you can learn a lot! The audience can and do see a lot of new ideas, and maybe a new twist on an old one. The judges are forced to examine more closely certain aspects of the performance as a whole and maybe appreciate how to apply it to their clowning. The people back stage (the ones no one see's) can absorb how to put on a show, and how to move people on and off stage smoothly. No matter what vantage point you choose there is always something to learn.

Even my position provided plenty of opportunity to learn I hope I can and do apply it to next year's convention. I personally want to thank all the people who helped me at the convention. I am reluctant to name names for fear of forgetting someone. The people who helped know who they are and they have my gratitude.

The number of competitors remained high this year. The numbers are as follows; Make-up 37, Single skits 10, Group skits 16, Single parade 21, Group parade 13, performance 10, Single balloon 10, multiple balloons 9, Balloon arrangement 7, all this for a grand total of 133 separate entries! we must remember that all the group entries and some of the performance entries contained more than one clown, so at the convention attended by less than 150, we had — 202 participants!!!!!!. ——Truly exceptional numbers!

If you were a part of this year's competition thank you I hope it was a pleasant experience for you, if not let me know how we can make it better next year. Thank You for allowing me the opportunity to serve as

competition chairman. I'll see all of you next year in the metroplex for our first-time summer-time convention.

He is an active supporter of TCA and believes that Texas clowns are the best. John has taught classes with his local alley, at TCA, COAI and at the local college.

John John is wonderful in the art of ballooning, but he doesn't just make balloons, he entertains the children with special balloons. Each child in front of John John is the most special of all at that time.

You should see John John on stilts! This 9-foot cowpoke can mosey with the best of them with pocket magic and stickers. Even at 9-foot it is hard to imagine how he has room in his body for such a huge heart.

John has been clowning for over 19 years and is truly committed to the art. While not usually a competitive clown, he is a willing participant when called on to step in.

His clowning has taken him to Canada, the Bahamas, Mexico and throughout the U.S. He has recently developed a love for the Sioux Tribe children in North Dakota from his last four mission trips. He has clowned for Make a Wish and Give Kids the World in Florida.

Kids will love these December Games

Rudolph Run or Red Nose Relay

Supplies:

- Large jar of Vaseline
- Popsicle sticks
- Wet-Ones
- Red pom-poms

Trash bag



Kids line up in 2 or more even teams. At the other end is a small table, TV tray, or chair holding the jar of Vaseline with popsicle sticks and red pom-poms.

One child from each team runs to the other end, smears Vaseline on his/her nose using the sticks. Then with hands behind his/her back, the child bends forward into the pom-poms. They now have red clown noses (or Rudolph noses) stuck to their face. They run back to their team, tag up, and the next child repeats the process until the whole line has run. Once the entire team is back in place, they all must sit down. The first team sitting is the winner.

Wet-Ones are on hand to get the gooey Vaseline off their little faces.

Dixie Cup Relay

Supplies:

- 2 empty 1-liter plastic bottles
- bathroom sized Dixie cups (with kid friendly designs)
- 2 buckets
- water

trash bag (for all the Dixie cups)

Divide kids into 2 teams. Ask for a volunteer from each team who doesn't mind getting wet. (There's always someone willing, especially in the summer heat.) The volunteer lies down at one end of the playing field. He/she holds the empty plastic bottle upright on his/her forehead.

The remainder of the team lines up at the other end. Each member dips his/her Dixie cup into the bucket of water to fill it.

Once filled, each team member in turn, runs to the other end, trying not to spill any water. Then, holding the cup waist high, they pour the water into the bottle positioned on their teammate's head, then run back. Once the teams have completed their rotation, they sit down. The team with the most water in their bottle is declared the winner.

He was a Gentleman and a real Prince to TCA members.

Billy was born in Holladay, TN on October 30, 1931. He was one of four children. He graduated from Holladay High School. He is survived by Clara "the love of his life" whom he met at the movie theater in Camden, TN. They were married on October 30, 1951, and recently celebrated their 57th wedding anniversary. He is also survived by daughter and son-in-law Denise and Sam Ferguson and grandson, Josh Ferguson.

During their first year of marriage Billy was drafted into the U.S. Army. He served in Korea. After the war he returned to Camden and went to work at the local Genesco shoe plant. This is where he learned the skill of shoe making.

In 1962, he and family moved to Nashville, TN and there he started selling the machinery and supplies to make shoes. He later went into business for himself as Prince Machinery and Supplies.

During this time Billy became a Shriner Clown. As he was putting together his costume he couldn't find any clown shoes that were comfortable, so he made a pair for himself. Little did he know at that time that making himself a pair of clown shoes would create such a stir. Other clowns noticed the shoes and asked him to make them a pair. From that Billy Prince


Custom Clown Shoes was born and one of the first pair of clown shoes he made was for professional clown Jack "Freckles" Anderson.

Billy started attending clown conventions. First without Clara, and then later with her. He would come home and tell stories of the conventions and all the fantastic people that he had met. Even as Billy's health declined he still loved the conventions. He went to his last convention in early October, 2008.

Billy passed away early on Monday, November 24, 2008. He was a man that loved life and loved telling people how much he loved them.

Billy, you will be missed but never forgotten. Thanks to all of you who loved and supported my Dad.
