I had so much fun drawing this cover. It's based, of course, on "A Charlie Brown Christmas", the 1965 holiday special which has become a classic. I believe it has remained so popular because of it's profound and simple message, it's humor, and the artistry and integrity of Charles Schulz, the creator of the comic strip "Peanuts". "Peanuts" itself was an American classic, and it's as much a part of our culture as Santa Claus, Mickey Mouse and Coca-Cola. But "Peanuts", and it's characters and holiday specials have survived Schulz and endured because of the depth of the work, it's subtlety and intelligence. There was always gentle slapstick, funny pictures and endearing characters of course, but there was also depth of feeling and comedy based on a deeper understanding of our human weaknesses and strengths. Watch the special, accentuated by the music of by the jazz piano great Vince Guaraldi, and you'll find the melancholy of the holidays as well as the joy. There's a search for meaning and a moment of truth. There's redemption by kindness and the power of love. It's kind of a masterpiece, really, and I think it's the work of an artist who sat down every day to a labor of love. To me, that's a job well done and a life well lived.

\$ \$ \$ OPTIONS \$ \$ \$: You Can Make a "Professor's Nightmare"


There are several illusion items that you can make and use with similar success of the commercially produced items. There are books authored by David Ginn, Brenda Marshall, and Duane (or David & Teesha) Laflin to mention a few, that give you items to make from common items.

The first one I'll mention is "The Professor's Nightmare." This is a rope trick that can be made from common clothesline cord/rope. Some places (like Kudos) you can buy rope cheap by the foot and you only need about 6 feet. Pull the stiffener cords out of the middle of the rope to produce a very flexible cord, cut to desired lengths and wrap each end with electrician's tape to preserve the ends. The lengths can be adjusted some to accommodate hand sizes. My hands are not large and I use lengths of 8", 21", and 36".

The story can mention needing 3 ropes of the same length and how the store clerk must have really messed up. Now that people know that the desire is to go to three lengths the same length, you can arrange the ropes in your hand. There are a couple of ways to do this. My way is at first I hold the ropes in my left hand because I am right handed. The ropes should be shortest near the thumb, the middle sized next moving to the left, and then the long rope. I take each rope one at a time and put the dangling end up beside the last rope in my hand. So the first time I bring the dangling end of the short rope and lay it beside the longest rope end that does not dangle. Next I put the medium rope, (again the dangling end) next to the short rope end and the last dangling end from the longest rope next to the medium end. As I talk about the mess the clerk has made, I'm arranging the ends to the ropes in my hands never really moving them except to wiggle them and insure the loop from short rope is now inside my hand and invisible from the audience seating. You can then pick the first two rope ends near the tips of my fingers, then skip one tip and choose the next rope tip. As you are getting hold of these ends firmly, you will need to work your thumb of the left hand, behind the last selection to hold all rope tips that were not selected. In an instant finalize the illusion by pulling down all the selected ropes, while holding the remaining ends firmly, but leaving the other area only slightly firm to allow the rope to slide through a newly created loop formed by the short length of rope. Now you seem to be holding three ropes very near the same length. If you are left handed, you will need to reverse hands on the explanation to get an acceptable result.

This trick can be adapted to gospel illusions by showing the lengths of rope to stand for the sins in our life, appearing big, medium, or small to us, but all are the same in God's eyes, or all people are different, but all are the same in God's eyes. For Romans 3:23 says, "all have sinned and come short of the glory of God," Romans 6:23 says, "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." John 3:16 says, "God gave his only begotten son that whosoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life." Romans 10:9-10 says, "That if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord, and you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your mouth that you confess and are justified and it is with your heart that you believe and are saved. So if we are all the same, and have sinned, then we are also all the same that if we confess that Jesus is Lord and God raised him from the dead, we will be saved.

Anyway you can make up your own patter or alter suggested ones as you like, but the points to make should hold the trick together so the audience will follow and realize the change to be the desired outcome.

I'm a First of May Clown. I'm having a great time learning how to reach the audience and make balloon animals, but WOW I'm having trouble buying enough props and pieces of equipment to do a great show. What can you tell me to help me expand without breaking me financially. ---- Caddilac Heart

Dear Caddie,

I really remember how expensive the first year was. I am reasonably crafty and I was able to make several pieces inexpensively. I am going share some of those with our readers over the next few issues, watch for articles titled, "\$ \$ \$ OPTIONS \$ \$ \$". MAYBE some of our readers will share a favorite item that they made. Also, remember to use some creativity with your first costume. It's possible to find pieces or the whole costume at Salvation Army, Goodwill or other resale type stores. I have a friend that shops garage sales and has picked up a lot of illusions and other items for her clown, real cheap, from clowns that for some reason are downsizing their stuff or getting out of the business. There are gems to be had. One year at convention one clown had found her entry at the Thrift store and had made a costume addition to it to complete her idea. Check out the toy section for some great items to enhance skits or walk-around entertainment. Cowtown Alley, as do other alleys, has a garage sale within the program time on their meeting one month a year. One and all benefit. --- Minnie Dear Minnie,

I do gospel clowning but I have difficulty finding props for use and material, so much is there for secular use. ---Spiritually Seeking

Dear Seeker,

"What God has joined together, let no man frustrate." Or something like that. Okay, having said that, I want to encourage you. As your experience and additional training accumulate, so will your ability to adapt generic props/skits to gospel uses. But in the mean time, please check out David Ginn's website (*www.ginnmagic.com*), J.T. Sykes (*www.bubbasikes.com*), Ralph Dewey(*dewey.balloonhq.com*/) and Laflins' website

Ralph Dewey(*dewey.balloonhq.com*/) and Laflins' website (*www.wholesalemagiconline.com*/). They are all gospel led creators and lecturers, and have props with gospel instructions. Also, I have typed, "gospel skit" into Google and found a wealth of free copy out there. Of course all will not meet your needs, one must pray and be selective, but it will give you ideas of your own if you can't use what you see.

Texas is also blessed to be the home of one of the best gospel training weekends anywhere. All but one out of about the last 14 years, Sagemont Baptist Church has hosted Joey to the World on the first weekend in February. The group that organizes this event are Spirit led. Planning for the TCA 2012 Convention? A Few Helpful Tips ---

The 2012 convention is being held in the same hotel (Westin DFW, Irving TX) as the 2011 convention. This is the second year of our 3 year contract. We are trying this multi-year contract idea as a way to keep room rates down. We were able to lock-in the room rate (at \$89/night for up to four occupants in a room) for the full 3 year contract. Please plan to stay at the convention hotel and book your rooms early. Booking with the convention hotel helps TCA meet its contractual room block and avoid very costly meeting room A limited number of suites are available at \$149/ expenses. night. Also, when you make your hotel reservation, you may request to have a refrigerator in your room (the hotel has a limited supply of refrigerators, so book early). Remember these convention room rates will only be honored if you book your room(s) before mid-July 2012 (the exact deadline will be published as soon as it is finally set).

Even though the convention is in August and it is usually VERY HOT outside in Texas in August - pack a sweater or light jacket as the hotel meeting rooms are COLD!

A Hospitality Room will be available each morning and evening during the convention. Light snacks are available in the Hospitality Room. The hotel allows TCA to use the Presidential Suite for their Hospitality Room. This is a very nice suite, but can still get crowded if everyone attends at the same time. Please understand that the larger meeting rooms (on the ground floor) are not available for Hospitality purposes - this violates the hotel policies -- as no outside food can be served in ground floor rooms. So please understand if the Hospitality Room is a little crowded.

There will be NO Door Decorating contest at the 2012 TCA Convention. This is also against hotel policy.

The Board is still in the planning stages for several fun events during the convention. Read <u>The Joey Journal</u> and watch the TCA website (www.TexaClownAssociation.com) for more details as the plans are finalized. Some events will be contests with prizes, so plan to join the fun and WIN!

Remember you must be a TCA member to attend the convention. TCA dues are due on April 1^{st} . Please pay your dues promptly to ensure you do not miss any issues of <u>The</u> <u>Joey Journal</u> that may contain informative details about the upcoming convention.

Only TCA members registered for the convention will be allowed to shop in the convention Dealers Room. Day rate registrations will be available for folks who wish to shop only.

Story telling

The story is the main attraction, if you are a beginner, choose a story in a fun and unique way. Choose a story that is easy to remember, has few characters, and tells something with which you can identify.

There are many types of stories, repetitive and tall tales for instance. Search for stories in your local library. You can research plays, folk tales, old children's books, magazines and stories about holidays. You can also examine books about different countries. Think about your childhood memories to inspire you.

If you are new to story telling look for stories that may use a few props or for the kids to act out the story. Use balloons as props or even costume such as crowns, etc to enhance the story. Look for ways to include audience participation.

Read the story over and over until you have learned it. Recite the story out loud to hear how it sounds, use a mirror while telling the story looking for facial expressions and body language.

Once you have your story create a routine to go with the story. Build props or use existing props. Lay the props out to make sure there are no repairs needed or build props to create a visual while telling your story. If you chose balloons you can make them prior to your performance or make the balloons as you tell the story creating the feeling the story should bring. Incorporate traditional themes from holidays or a dance from a country from the story or dance of your choice. Keep a spiral or folder with jokes or other information relating to your story theme. Make notes in the order which you will tell it and include the title and where the story originated. Know your material to see where to include the audience participation.

You might want to give your performance to a small audience such as a local day care, church or school. While you deliver your performance enhance various parts of the story with expression and vary the length of your sentences. Slip in unexpected words, voice pitch or expressions to keep the attention of your audience. It's also important to let your audience know when the ending is near and then bring the story to a close.

After story time its always good to get a feed back. Send a form to the person in charge to critique the performance. Its also good to send a thank you note.

TCA Convention Registration Scholarship Guidelines

 The number of scholarships awarded for each TCA Convention registration each year will be determined by the Board and/or the Education Committee and based on funds available.

Scholarship fund must maintain a minimum \$500.00 balance.

- All applications must be received by April 1, 2012 to the Education committee.
- 3. All applicants must be TCA members who have maintained membership for the last two years or more.
- 4. Education Committee, Board Members, and their immediate families are not eligible to apply. Recipient's must wait two years before reapplying.


