

## What's Going on with Competition??? Diana "Buttons" McCurtain-Talbert

I wanted to take a few moments to share with our members some thoughts on the upcoming convention and competition. My firm belief is that convention should always be fun, but second, it should always be about learning. I encourage you, as you prepare to come to convention to stretch yourself. It can be scary, but extremely rewarding. I stretched beyond my comfort zone at WCA this year. I had gone to convention, without plans of doing anything other than makeup and costume. At the last minute (literally in the hotel room) I decided to compete in single skits with no props, and no music; just me... Needless to say, it was not my best work, but I will never again feel inadequate if I don't have a prop. After going out on that limb, I know at the very least I can use myself, and my character to clown, and that is what being a clown is all about, after all. If you have never competed and are thinking of doing it this year, please make sure that you take the opportunity to go to the TCA website so that you can download the TCA Competition Manual. You should read this, and come prepared. It's a shame when someone does well only to be disqualified because they did not follow simple rules. Another thing that I would like to make sure potential competitors understand; is the difference between a performance and a skit. Remember, a skit tells a story. It has a beginning, middle and an end, and there is a blow off. A performance does not have to follow that type of criteria.

On another note, we are going through a bit of a change this year. I will be serving as the TCA Competition Director as well as serving in the capacity of the Host Alley Competition Chair. Needless to say, my multiple personalities will be very busy. I will be looking for qualified judges for all areas of competition and I will also be looking for those willing to help with staging, running, time keeping etc. etc. etc. I wanted to also let you, the membership know that we will be looking for a new Competition Director for next year. This is an appointed position; it is not an elected position. As this is a very important

position, I am hoping that there are those who might be interested in filling this role in 2013. If you are interested please let me know as I am hoping that I will find someone who will shadow me this year so that you will know what to expect next year... Did I mention that a great perk of being the TCA Competition Director is that TCA will cover your registration fee?

#### Are You On Track for Convention?

All aboard! Convention is almost here. We want to remind you of a few things and inform you of some other things to make sure you are on track for this TCA Convention.

The Board has been working hard to put together a full and fun convention for you this year. Angel Ocasio is our main Headliner for the 2012 convention. If you have never had the pleasure of seeing Angel perform or lecture before, well you are in for a real treat! If you have seen him before, then I don't have to say anything more - you will want to see him again - I KNOW! He is extremely talented and an excellent teacher. You can read more about Angel in his bio on the TCA website under the Convention button. Angel has 'donated' two 1 on 1 sessions (a private learning session for just one convention registrant and their group skit buddies with Angel) for the 2012 convention. To be as fair as possible the Board has decided on 2 ways to 'award' these sessions. One will be a door prize at the General Membership Meeting on Thursday during the convention. All you have to do is come to the meeting and stay (must be present to win). The winner will be drawn at the end of the meeting (session to be scheduled before the end of the convention). The second session will be Raffled - so buy as many raffle tickets as you can and put them in the jar for the Angel Session. The winner will be drawn on Friday night so that they may schedule their session with Angel sometime on Saturday (before the convention ends). So easy! Just come to convention and attend the meeting and buy raffle tickets! Good luck! Remember the funds from the raffle go to the TCA charity of choice, which this year will be the TCA Education Fund.

Angel isn't the only talented lecturer that will be on hand to teach you new things. Bubba Sikes, Cheri Venturi, Kelly Ballagh, Jackie Garner, Bombin and several others will also be there - you can find more information about the headliners and lecturers on the TCA website.

We are hoping to have more social time too! We all really enjoy visiting and we do understand that sometimes the Hospitality Room can get a bit too crowded. The hotel will not allow us to bring food into the ground floor meeting rooms, hence the Hospitality Room is one of the suites upstairs. But we sure can use those large ground floor meeting rooms to VISIT! So hang around and get to know some new TCA folks and catch-up with some old friends too! Watch for folks with the FIRST TIME Ribbons - they probably could use a little guidance and some TCA friends.

There will be classes on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. You should try to arrive no later than 4:00pm on Wednesday to get the most of this TCA convention. A tentative convention schedule is also posted on the TCA website.

Wednesday - One of Angel's lectures will be on Wednesday so try not to arrive too late. That evening, the TCA Board will host an Ice Cream Social in the Hospitality Room, so come hungry. After that we will have some Jams in the ground floor Gallery. We are going to add a Puppet Jam this year so bring those lonely and abandoned puppets.

Thursday - don't miss the General Membership Meeting (at 4:00pm) - it's election year and you will want your say in who leads TCA in the next 2 years. Also, remember that it is your chance to win an 'Angel Session'. That night we have the Performance Competition followed by a short Medicine Show (comedy magic) after which the hospitality Room will be open and Jams will happen in the Gallery.

Friday night Angel will present "An Evening With Angel Ocasio", which will be followed by a short party/social time, the Hospitality Room and more Jams.

Saturday evening the Awards Banquet starts at 7:00pm. Typical attire for this event is smart casual-to-dressy ('churchy' for some). The winners of all the various competitions and the Best All Around Clown, the Spark Plug Awards, and the TCA Ambassador Award will all be announced during the banquet.

The Hospitality Room will be open after the Banquet so we can all continue to enjoy the moment.

**Sunday** morning wraps up the whole affair with a worship service and a Breakfast. At that time the baton will be handed to the new Board and the next convention hosts.

Of course, in between all of this fun we have crammed at least 35 classes (some of them will be fun too! There is nothing better than having fun while you learn something!) and all of the various competitions - including the first time ever TCA Face Painting Competitions. So you can see it promises to be something you do not want to miss!

If you cannot come for the whole convention - we have a Day Rate of \$75 (it includes all classes that day and Dealer Room entry but no meals). There is a Face-Painting Track on Thursday, so if Face Painting is your thing, that is the day you need to be there! There are classes offered during the convention for all levels of clowning expertise, from the novice or beginner clown to the seasoned performer.

If you have not already registered for the convention, please pre-register. This saves you money and allows the host to know how many folks will be on hand and better plan for the crowd. Also, book your room at the convention hotel - you can see the schedule is jam-packed so you do not want to miss anything by leaving the hotel. Be sure to pay your TCA dues (you will have to pay when you arrive if you have not paid in advance - better to take care of that before you arrive). Then once you check-in at the convention - review your program and the convention schedule to decide how best to spend your time to your own advantage. Check out your Goodie Bag and put anything you do not want into the Recycle Box at the Registration desk. Be sure to Sign-Up for the competitions EARLY - do not miss the cutoff times (you can cancel later if you have to, but you cannot sign-up later). Be sure to **READ THE RULES** as posted on the TCA website for each category you plan to enter. Nothing hurts more than being disqualified or penalized because you didn't follow the rules (remember the TCA rules may be

different than those for other clown organizations). Sign-up for the Banquet and Breakfast too - as soon as the sign-up boards are posted.

Just like last year - we are working with the hotel for them to sell box lunches on Thursday and Friday (and maybe Saturday too). These lunches were reasonably priced and some folks said that they were big enough to share. So you can save time by buying the box lunches. Sign-up sheets might be necessary to give the hotel an idea of how many lunches to prepare - so watch for that and sign up each day. Angel Ocasio will lecture during the lunch hour on both Thursday and Friday. The Hospitality Room will be open each morning with light eats and drinks and every late night for snacks and smiles. Hopefully, between the hospitality Room and the Box Lunches, you will not have to spend much money on food during the convention, but the hotel does have a restaurant on site and there are some fast-food places not too far away (one eatery right across the street).

Casual clothes (clowny clothes) are typically worn during the day at convention (sometimes the classrooms are very cool - so a sweater might be a good idea too). While you are packing, if you have a leftover lanyard (name tag holder) from a previous convention, please bring one along. We have some but they are in short supply and if you have one of your own that will help the hosts. We will be happy to take any extra lanyards you no longer want. Most folks do not get into clown (make-up and wardrobe) unless they are competing or having photos made. However, being in make-up might make you feel more involved so feel free to wear your make-up and/or wardrobe during the convention. And hopefully we will take a Group Photo too - so you might want to be in make-up for that event. And speaking of photos - this is a GREAT time to have professional photos made of your clown. So check the program and schedule and plan your budget accordingly.

There are always lots of ways to spend money at convention - starting in the Dealer Room - we will have lots of dealers on hand to sell you the things that clowns need most. Also, there are

Convention T-shirts available, but only if you PRE-ORDER (if you want one, send your Registration form and payment as directed on the form - the form is posted on the TCA website). Do not wait until you arrive at the convention - it will be too late! Of course, there is also lunch (and dinner on your own) and photos and RAFFLE tickets! So I hope you have been saving your pennies (and nickels and dimes and dollars too) so that you can stock up on all of the goodies we will have to offer at the 2012 TCA Convention. Now if you are the gambling kind, there is a contest for Program Ads too - each individual (no businesses or commercial ads will qualify) business card sized ad you buy in the convention program will receive one chance to win a \$100 CASH RIZE! Larger ads get multiple entries (chances). So you might be able to get some more convention spending money just by spending a little bit. See article about the Program Ads in The Joey Journal. Hurry, there is a deadline coming soon!

# Safety First: Or Some Things I Have Learned... OR - (Why is it, that what I need is where I'm not?)

- 1. Always carry ID on your BODY, not in a separate bag or locked in the trunk of your car. I have a flat billfold with my Driver's License, AAA card, Proof of Ins. Card, AND all of my medical cards: ie-medications that I am on, any allergies, person to contact in case of emergency, my insurance cards, etc. Included in this small array of items is some petty cash and one Reason: In case of emergency, it is very easy to be separated from your bag or possessions, or even a person who knows you personally. I have a good friend who collapsed on a parking lot in a diabetic coma. As she fell, her sports bag went flying under a parked car. When someone came to her rescue, they had no clue who she was or who to contact, until they found her sports bag with her bathing suit in it. She had locked her purse in her trunk of the car to go to water aerobics. When her wet swim suit was found, they went into the Sports Center and they were able to identify her and contact her family and get I have seen clowns lock their purse etc. in medical attention. the car and take only the car keys with them into a gig. If it is a large event, who would know?
- 2. When I have a gig at a private address, I try to "scope out" the day before how to find the address. There is so much construction and detours everywhere I go, that it is wise to be able to locate the event the best way. This is especially true, if the event is after dark.
- 3. Carry your cell phone with you (preferably charged up, ha). Hang it on your bag, (turned off), but where it can be easily reached.
- 4. Clown with a partner if possible. First of all, it is more fun, but secondly it is safer for you and your client. Unfortunately, it is easy for false accusations to be made against you. Safety in numbers!

- 5. If you are going to be standing for a long period of time, (for example doing balloons or face painting), carry a jell mat to stand on. It makes a big difference on your level of exhaustion.
- 6. Be kind to your back and shoulders. Use a roller cart, roller suitcase, or dolly to carry your supplies. Bunge straps are my friend.
- 7. Make sure your gas tank is full before the gig. It is not a wise idea to get gas after dark, in a strange neighborhood, and in clown.
- 8. Back Up: Take more or prepare more than what you plan to use. You never know when you might be asked to do more or stay longer. Take something "age appropriate" for all ages. You never know who might show up. Don't leave home without bubbles. They are the perfect ice breaker for the shy child or infant.
- 9. Even though your sound system might work perfectly on batteries, take an extension cord, just in case.
- 10. Texas in the summertime...ASK: indoors or out? Outdoors: No wig, no collar, no long sleeves, no gloves. Jell neck bands are life savers, even indoors.. Take your own cold water! I say "NO, to outdoor BD parties in July and August.
- 11. Ending your line— I have tried a number of ways to end my line when doing balloons or face painting. None of them were satisfactory. I never want to leave some child in a line when it is time to go, so to eliminate that problem, I try to survey the number of children waiting (at least a half hour before the end of the gig). I give each child a ticket (\$ Store variety). I tell the last child (and parent) that I will have a special treat for that child, if they will inform others that they are the last one. As each child approaches my chair, I take their ticket, place it in my pocket, (because they can be used several times), and present the "last child" with a special trinket (\$ store variety). This eliminates some potentially "sticky" situations.

Have a safe, fun-filled summer clowning by eliminating unforeseen problems!
