## Keedo's Prop Shop: Easy Magic Trick

For this month we are going to make a very easy magic trick. This trick starts with three



separate silks

that are stuffed into a clear tube and right before your eyes shoot out of the tube in a stream, attached together. You could purchase this at the magic store, but where's the fun in that??

You will need a 9-½ inch long clear Plexiglas tube that is 1-¼ inches in diameter. Other supplies are ½ wide decorative tape and two of those little rubber bands people with braces wear. To perform the trick you will also need 3 different colored 11-inch square silks.

After cutting the tubing to 9-1/2 inches in length, smooth off the edges with fine grit sandpaper or an emery board. Wrap one width of the tape around each end, flush with the ends. TaDAA! You're finished.

Prior to performing the trick, put one rubber band on each end of the tube on the area where the tape is. I have gold tape on mine. I thought it was flashy, yet a blending color with the rubber band. Show the three different color silks. Choose the colors that best illustrate the story you're telling. Stuff the silk you want

to be in the middle of the three-silk streamer into the tube first. Leaving one inch of the silk hanging out the end of the tube. Fold the end over the outside of the tube and hold it there while blowing into the tube. This will force the opposite corner of the silk to pop out the other end of the tube. You could also push it through with your magic wand. At this point the silk is threaded though the tube and you can hold a corner of it in each hand. Now as you first start putting a corner of another silk in one end of the tube. it overlaps with the corner of the original silk that is still sticking out of the end of the tube. This is when you roll the rubber band off the end of the tube with one hand and the two silks are attached. Be careful a finger from the other hand doesn't get caught with the silks in the rubber band. Practice this move until it is one fluid motion. Now that they are tied together, continue stuffing the second silk into the tube. Flip the tube around and with the other end of the first silk and the third silk repeat the previous maneuver. When you're finished, you should have a clear tube with three brightly colored silks completely stuffed inside the two ends. You have been telling your story the whole time you were doing these motions. Now finish the patter and hold the (Continued on page 20)

However, we mustn't forget one very important thing, and that's noticing the opportunities to just play when we're clowning, that's right 'Play'. I went to the old trusted dictionary and here's what I found as a definition for the word play; amusement as the spontaneous activity of children, Hey, we can do that! I know it's important that we learn skills that entertain and we should have confidence and presentation skills for sure, but our clown character should always look for opportunities of spontaneous activity and 'play'.

In a formal setting individuals like to be entertained, they like to sit back and enjoy a structured perfor

mance. We, as clowns, can do that if the situation calls for it. However, in an informal setting such as a family party, festival grounds, walk-arounds or even in a hospital room, a clown can be an invitation 'to play'. Regardless of age or setting



when individuals are in the presences of a clown they expect lively conversation and some silly, fun stuff to take place. Use your sense of play to focus positive attention on the audience around you. Everyone likes to be acknowledged by a friendly, approachable clown. Take time to interact and create a playful environment, give your actions your full attention. Notice what's around to play with; a chatty shirt, a mirror, a musical card, a hat with a little bling or even just a little music. It makes no difference what the fun object, silly conversation or comedy antics are. It's our playful approach and our character's expressions and reactions that communicate to those around us; "Do You Wanna Play"? I enjoy hearing from you... bebopclown@hotmail.com

## **Ambassador**

Hello to our Texas Clowns.

I want to take a moment to thank everyone for the honor of having received the 2016 TCA Ambassador of Clowning award. When I look at all the clowns who have received that award, it truly humbles me to be added to that group. Little did I know 10 years ago, that I would become so enamored with the life of a clown and the joy we bring to those we come in contact with, that 10 years later I would still be wearing the red nose and waving my rubber chicken? These years have flown by, and the only regret I have in clowning is that I don't have time to do more than I do. As we begin to prepare for our TCA Convention for 2017, the time is coming for you our members to honor someone else with this award. I ask that you begin thinking now, about that person you know who has exemplified clowning with joy and passion. Look for that clown that gives their very best every time whether they are doing something which is paid, voluntary, or for competition. Look for the heart of the clown as you seek to nominate our Ambassador for 2017.

A little bit of history for you: Texas Clown Association (TCA) was founded in 1982 and the first TCA AMBASSADOR OF CLOWNING AWARD was presented in 1983.



This award is to recognize and hon or the TCA member who most exemplifies the art of clowning and supports and promotes TCA. The award is a "lifetime achievement award" meaning that a member is only honored once (in a lifetime) with this prestigious award. You might say "once an Ambassador always an Ambassador" and hopefully the recipients do continue to promote and support TCA and clowning long after being so named. But also, because it is only presented once in a lifetime, it takes more than a little bit of clowning and TCA support to earn this award. TCA Ambassador Award recipients are granted lifetime membership in TCA (meaning they no longer pay annual dues - at the TCA Board of Directors' discretion). The award is usually presented during the annual TCA convention but an Ambassador selection is not mandatory

each year. Nominees should have the following qualifications and/or traits:

- Must be current and active member of TCA
- Must be known for his/her dedication and promotion of clowning without personal gain
- Should be well-rounded clown, i.e. someone who gives to the community, is an active volunteer, and who is exposed or is a professional in the art of clowning.
- Should promote TCA in all facets of clowning, and always strive to be positive, upbeat, agreeable, and have a fair attitude. Be willing to share ideas and be available to assist with a smile.

Nomination letters should explain why the nominee should be considered for the award and provide examples of the points listed above - it is not enough to just say you want to nominate the person. The nominations are reviewed by a committee made up of past recipients of the award. Remember, that while most of the committee members are active in TCA, it is possible that they do not know every qualified member. Nominations should include sufficient details describing the nominee to the Committee members as if they do not know the nominee. Be sure to include such facts as:

• How long this the nominee been an active supporting TCA member?

- Have they held any positions in their alley or on the TCA board or TCA committees?
- How do they support and promote TCA in their clowning?
- How have they exhibited extra-ordinary clownmanship?
- How has the nominee been shown to be positive, upbeat, agreeable and sharing? Are they unselfish in assisting others, caring and most of all, just there when needed with no thought of being reimbursed for their time or effort?
- How have they displayed being a well-rounded clown; someone who gives to the community as an active volunteer, and who also demonstrates professionalism in the art of clowning?
- How has this nominee shown his/ her dedication and promotion of the art of clowning in assisting others?

Nominations will be accepted from CURRENT TCA members—only. Nominees must be CURRENT TCA members (to check membership status, contact the TCA Treasurer). Be sure to include your name and TCA number on your nomination letter as well as the REAL name and CLOWN name of your nominee (Include your contact information too in case the committee has any questions about your nomination). A list of the Ambassador Award recipients can be found on the TCA website. Remember, do not nominate any members who have already received the award.

I will be taking nominations by regular mail or e-mail. They must be dated or post-marked no later than the published deadline of September 10, 2017. I will validate each nomination received by the deadline, meaning I will be confirming the membership status of both the nominating member and their nominee.

P.T. Barnum said "There is no greater picture than that of 10,000 smiling children. No brighter music than their clear-ringing laughter.

That I, with my small amusements, have created such precious art is my life's proudest achievement."

## Let's Talk, Things We Should Do and Not Do While Clowning

### 1. Clowns Code of Ethics

Fulfill obligations – If you say you are going to be at the event from 3:00 - 5:00 then show up and be ready to perform by 2:45 and if you work over a little that's OK.

Make the best of any situation and not complain - One time I had a birthday party and there was bad weather that day. When I arrived at the home the electric power was off. What to do? I asked the mother if she had candles. She said no but her husband was a fisherman and he had lanterns. So it was a little warm and dark but the kids had a great time. Sometimes you have to improvise.

No profanity, smoking, drinking or abusive behavior - Clowns need to be funny and playful. Why would you even think about using profanity or abusive behavior during any job much less if you are entertaining children? I say if you smell like cigarette smoke or alcohol that will push the kids away from you.

Costumes should be clean and in good repair and makeup carefully applied – If you want to be called a professional clown you need to look like one. If your costume is showing wear then replace it. Put back some money from each job for that purpose. You could also use

some of that money to go to TCA conventions. There you can shop in the dealer room, go to classes, meet new clowns and improve yourself professionally.

Once makeup and costume are complete remain entirely intact and in character – When I put my nose on and go out in public I'm in my clown character. Going to and from the job you can come in contact with people that see you and may need a clown sometime. Always stay in character. The more you look and act like a clown will be to your advantage. Have business cards with you at all times.

2. Working for an agent or other **clown** – When another clown or an agent hires you to do a job for them there are some things to remember. You are not only representing yourself but also them. Always be very professional and have their business cards with you. While doing the job if someone asks for a card I give them the card of the person that hired me with my clown name on the back. I tell them I would love to be at their event so contact the person on the card and tell them you would like to have me do your event.

**3. Talk about tipping** - When I'm contacted about an event I always

ask about tipping. I have worked jobs just for tips. Some clients don't want you to take tips. I let them know I'll not advertise for tips but if someone wants to give me a tip I'll accept it from them. If I'm told I can accept tips I wear a tipping badge to let everyone know I take tips.


4. Differences in Party Clown and Hospital or Nursing Home Clown - Know your audience. This means a party clown can do things that you would not want to do at a hospital. You need to be aware of your location and audience. Don't do a routine that will make the kids afraid or make a mess in the home. Hospital clowns need to use inside voices. They should not use props that the patients can touch unless it is a handout they can keep otherwise you have to put it in a plastic bag and take home to sanitize. Each hospital has orientations that clowns have to go through and continuous training.

your mouth, tilt your head back; point the tube at about a 45 o angle and blow very hard. It takes a lot of air. The tube is large around and you want the silks to really fly out of the other end. Catch the silks and show that they are connected, thus illustrating your story. Tip: Some people put an extra rubber band on each end incase one should break. I have never had that happen. Huff & Puff & Practice

5. Treating others while per**forming** – This not only pertains to the audience but other entertainers you are working with. I've been at shows (maybe at a clown convention) where the clown brought someone from the audience to help. If that person is a clown they need to act accordingly and not make faces, act silly or try to upstage the performer. Go along with what they say and be a good helper. For example when working with a partner in a skit and it is your time to say your part then you can add movement that is needed. When your partner takes the action stand still and let the focus be on them. Don't distract the audience because they may miss an important part of the skit. You need to be a team player.

These are only some ideas of mine to get us thinking about what clowns should do and not do.
