#### **Keedo's Prop Shop: Packs Small, Plays Big!** by Joyce "Keedo" Dowell

I'm writing about this as much for me as for you. If the other people I clown with didn't rein me



in, I would need a trailer for all the tricks & props every time I go somewhere. Scarves, I think, are the ultimate in packing small & playing big. You are able to load a couple of big scarves, a lot of smaller ones or steamer type scarves into a small When they are produced during the show they are large and colorful or maybe are printed with a picture or message. The drawback to silk scarves is that they are expensive. If you have a trusted clown friend, you might each buy one and then share with each other (saving half the expense).

Another thing that is very colorful and loads flat are spring flowers. They also come in various sizes. There are a variety of tricks that are large enough to be seen and the colorful pictures are printed on flat cardboard. Big playing cards or rope tricks don't take much room. Chalk Talks (stories told by drawing with a marker on big paper), tricks with paper (tearing/restore or folding / cutting it) and balloons also take up very little space, but are impressive. Sponge items squish little and play big. They are also good for packing

around that delicate or breakable trick you just had to have.

Any item that stores inside itself will pack small(er) and still surprise the audience. For example, the nesting wands that go from one "normal looking" wand to 12 different colored ones (each one slightly smaller and stored within the next larger wand). The balloon pump with the spring snakes coiled inside gets a good reaction. They make several rubber items like the coke or ketchup bottle that smashes flat to disappear. I have seen clowns use inflatable things. Those certainly pack flat if you blow them up after you get there and not at home. You laugh, but we've heard one clown's story about trying to pack inflatable inner tubes. Try to find things that pack flat, but more importantly, AL-WAYS consider the "wow factor" in whatever you purchase.

to the bigger picture by keeping an open heart and staying open to interactions with fellow attendees.


Take every opportunity to become involved in conversations with others, everyone is there to meet new clowns, they will be lucky to me you and you will be glad to meet them.

## TCA's 2014 Best All Around Clown Lulu "Boofa" Mire on What It's Like to Take Top Honors by David "Nibbles" Bean

Accomplished and mind-explosion. Those are the words that come to mind when Lulu "Boofa" Mire of Houston's Cheerful Clown Alley #166 reflects on what it was like being named Best All Around Clown at the 2014 TCA's annual convention last September. Accomplished, she explains, because of the dedicated hard work in designing and practicing her clowning bits, costumes and skills. "I was five months pregnant during convention and for the few months leading up to the convention, I was focused on all things clown. I worked on my skills reach for my goal of winning (the title)... So the word accomplished, to me, means accomplishing my big goal and earning something (as opposed to 'winning' something.) Winning was incredible, but knowing I worked hard to 'earn' it, was a pretty cool feeling."

The work she refers to in preparing for the convention competitions included not only polishing her established skills (face painting, balloons, plate spinning), but learning new ones as well—such as playing a toy accordion. She laughs, "Don't be fooled by the word 'toy', it doesn't

mean 'easier'!" Lulu played piano and has a regular accordion. but found the buttons on the smaller squeezebox very challenging. Lulu fondly remembers one extendaccordion ed practice, a drive from Houston to San Antonio. practiced in the

car and drove Rick and our puppy, Shiloh, up a wall playing the accordion in such small quarters. That cracked me up and motivated me to keep practicing all along I-10!"



and was always journaling about ideas or different ways of doing something. Since I didn't know how having a baby would change my life, I knew 2014 was my year to

Lulu also used the convention competitions as a reason to improve her face painting skills. "You get away with a lot being a clown, but if I am going to be hired to clown and face paint, I want to be able to provide quality work. Competition was the perfect time for me to start taking the steps toward being a legit face painter. I watched tons of online tutorials, read blogs, googled images, practice designs, researched paints, paint brushes, etc." It was work that paid off, with Lulu taking 1st Place in full face and 2nd place in cheek face painting. Those were just two of the seven medals she took home out of the ten competitive events (along with an eighth for being named Best All Around Clown, as well.)

Even though Lulu didn't place in her favorite category, Skits, she still thinks like a champion when assessing her performance. "I was so focused on practicing my other skills I knew I needed to work on, I didn't fully develop my single skit piece. Blerg! Well, all the more reason to attend future conventions! Competing is a great time to 'workshop' new pieces and get feedback on them." It's exactly that type of attitude that creates award-winning clowns and raises the bar in competitions, which in turn encourages us all to become better clowns.

Her advice to those attending a TCA convention and possibly competing for the first time? "Have fun, of course! Look at the schedule ahead of time to determine what classes you want to take. Try something new when you compete. Let's compete to grow! Take the opportunity to learn not just from class, but from all the awesome Texas clowns that have convened in one location. Meet new people. Make friends and network! Learn from fellow competitors' pieces. Headliners aren't just entertainers— they're teachers in action— learn from their show!"

Alright, so we get that being named TCA's Best All Around Clown is an accomplishment based on lots of dedication and hard work. But mind-explosion??? Lulu explains. "It felt like a fireworks show in my head each time I heard my name being called out [at the awards ceremony]... Bright, shiny, and lot of colors! It gives you a wonderful sense of validation that you're doing the right thing with your life! And when you feel that, it's like a mind-explosion! And your mind starts running like crazy thinking up all sorts of new clown ideas, writing skits in your head, sketching out new characters, creating new ways to share your clown with the world! You feel so alive! Winning Best All Around Clown was like competing in a marathon. You train for it because you know it is in you and that it is possible, but then accomplishing it is still like a wonderful surprise birthday party!"

From observing last year, it was easy to see there's a lot going on behind the scenes during the competitions. I know I've got some big shoes to fill from the great folks who have served before me.

I'll be looking for folks to help out where they can. I hope you will earnestly think about how you can help make our competition run smooth and be a blessing to everyone involved. Are you qualified to be a judge? Here are the TCA guidelines on judges:

#### Judging

- A. An uneven number of judges, 5 or 7, will be utilized.
  - 1. Selection
- a. The TCA Competition Director will select and contact all judges.
- b. All judges must be TCA members in good standing and must have been approved certified as a TCA judge by the TCA Competition Director.
  - 2. To qualify as a TCA judge, members must:
- a. Have a minimum of five (5) consecutive years experience in clowning and Makeup prior to the convention.
- b. Have experience in clowning through public performances, education, and teaching the art of clowning or competition. Competition experience should include placing within the top ten in international, regional, and/or local competitions.
- c. Have attended a judging seminar conducted at a TCA annual convention (on or after September 30, 1999), or a COAI judging seminar, an ISCA judging seminar or any other judging seminar certified by the Competition Director.
