



Duane Morgan Wilhite, 66, passed away on 20 December 2015 in Sweetwater, TX while traveling to his eldest granddaughter's wedding. He was born on August 10, 1949, in Des Moines, IA to Orlan and Mabel (Harban) Wilhite.

Duane grew up in the Philippines. He graduated from East High, Des Moines, IA in 1968. After high school he briefly attended college at Baptist Bible College in Clarks Summit, PA. Keedo's Prop Shop: Color Changing Teapot by Joyce "Keedo" Dowell

Today you'll need: a used or new teapot, one freezie-pop container, a coping saw, Epoxy glue & Polyurethane



(a clear paint). We are going to make a Color Changing Teapot. You can find a teapot at a thrift store & the freezie-pop container at a dollar store. Thoroughly clean the teapot & check for leaks. If it leaks put a layer of Polyurethane covering the bottom of the inside of the teapot. This will seal any leaks. With the coping saw cut the freezie-pop containers apart. Epoxy five of the containers to the bottom of the teapot. Be sure to put all the containers in the center with all the tops When gluing the tops touching. together, do a neat job so silks or crepe paper won't snag as they are pulled out. Allow everything to dry. Fill the kettle several times with water at different levels until you find a level where you can pour water & not flood the containers. Mark this with a Sharpie. If necessary, use a funnel to fill the pot to keep from spilling water on your silks. Now fill up the kettle with water & practice, practice, practice! I use five stem glasses with three drops each of different color food colorings dried overnight in four. Warm water in the teapot works best in re-19

activating the food coloring. When you pick up the glasses, hold them so your hand covers the food coloring area so no one sees it. I start with pouring water in the clear glass and take a drink. I continue with my patter and I pull out the green silk. Wrap it around the stem of the glass with the green coloring in it - pour the water and it looks as if you have poured green water out of the same teapot. Continue with blue, red, black, & yellow. I finish by poring water into the clear glass again. Ya'll choose colors for your own patter. Note to Gospel Clowns: I use these colors because the patter is the 23rd Psalm. I shall not want (clear), green pastures (green), still waters (blue), He leadeth me (red), shadow of death (black), anointed my head with oil (yellow), goodness & mercy (clear) This also can be used in a similar manner as the Wordless book is used for the Salvation Message. The written patter I use is on page 20.

Color Changing Teapot Lesson Patter by Joyce "Keedo" Dowell

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. (Pour clear water into the glass without food coloring in it.) Saying, He takes care of all my needs, food, money, water (take a drink). He maketh me lie down in green pastures, He leadeth me besides the still waters. (Pull out a green silk and pour water into the glass with the blue food coloring in it.) He restoreth my soul: He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. (Pull out a red silk and pour water into the glass with the red food coloring in it.) He is my Lord, my savior, he comforts me. Yea though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil for though art with me: thy rod and thy staff comfort me. (Pull out a black silk and pour water into the glass with the dark food coloring in it.) It says we walk through the valley of the shadow of death. We don't stop in it, we don't get stuck in it, we go all the way through and out the other side. So no matter how bad the situation seems to be, we will get through it and God will be with us the entire time. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies; thou anointed my head with oil: my cup runneth over. (Pull out a yellow silk and pour water into the glass with yellow food coloring in it.) Traditionally the honored guest at a banquet is anointed with oil. God does that for us. Imagine that, we are His honored guests. Surely goodness & mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever. (Pour out clear water again into the glass with no food coloring.) God is holy and pure and His love and kindness will be with you and me forever.


2. Clownified Ads You can list clown-related items for sale, trade or donation free of charge in our Clownified ads. Vendor businesses not included.
