

Tips-n-Tricks from Cheerful Clown Alley from Judy "Peep" Cornett

Tired of messing with sticky liquid adhesive to put on your clown nose? Had it with trying to scrape off all the little balls of dried, crusted rubber off your nose the rest of the day once you're done? Maybe you've tried the double-sided tape to adhere your red nose but find it too expensive once shipping charges are added to your purchases from mail order dealers, or you've run out and don't have time to wait for a shipment... try Hollywood Fashion Tape from your local drug or home store! Originally created to secure garments from causing various fashion faux pas, these double-side tape strips can be used to keep your clown nose in place! Each tin contains 36 strips (approximately 0.5" x 3") which will need to be cut in half for proper length for your face, giving you 72 uses in each package.

Set at a retail price of \$8.99, the cost of the strips vary considerably across retailers. CVS Pharmacies carry the strips at retail price, while Bed Bath & Beyond puts on a price tag of \$9.99 (of course we all know to never buy anything at BB&B without their standard 20% discount coupons, available through mail catalogs or online/email offers.) Joann Fabric and Craft Stores list the item at \$11.99.

while Walmart carries for the best price. An Amazon seller offers two tins for a price of \$11.79, if you like the product and want to stock up. Some retailers (such as WalMart) also offer an 18-count tin if you'd like to just try out the strips. These tins generally retail in the \$6-7 range.

Keedo's Prop Shop: by Joyce "Keedo" Dowell

This month vou will need a brown paper lunch bag, Ping-Pong balls, two or three color different



Sharpies and a small piece of clear plastic. We are going to make a simple magic trick. On the lower potion of one side of the sack, cut a 2-inch by 4-inch rectangle ½ inch from the bottom. Cut on the side that when the bag is folded flat the rectangle hole will be covered. Cut a piece of plastic from a page protector sleeve, report cover plastic, or from a transparency used with an overhead projector. (Something more substantial than cellophane). Cut the plastic slightly larger than the 2x4 hole. Tape the plastic over the hole from the inside with clear tape so that the plastic covers the hole. Color the 3 ping-pong balls. I left 1 white & colored 1 red & 1 royal blue. Whatever colors you choose, just make sure the colors are easily distinguishable one from another.

To use this trick, show the audience the sack & colored balls. Keep the window side of the sack facing you at all times. You can draw it out by saying the colors of the balls wrong & let them correct you. Get two volunteers. Have one child stand behind you (Vol #1) and to

one side with their back to you and the audience. Tell the second child pick as many balls as they want to. Show the balls to the audience while making the shushing motion with your finger to your lips so they won't yell out the colors. Drop the balls into the bag. Discard any left over balls. Have Vol #1 turn around. still staying behind you and to the side. (I use my right since I'm right handed) Hold the bag by the top (solid side to audience, window side to child) at arms length in your right hand. This should place it directly in the line of sight of Vol #1. Move the sack slightly so that the balls roll back & forth past the window, giv-



your ing helper every chance seeing at balls. the While doing this announce to everyone that Vol #1 (use their

name) will now be able to tell everyone the color & number of balls in the sack. Amazing! They did it! Rant & rave & clap about this. While still holding the sack by it's top in your right hand and clapping, turn your body enough to the audience so that they see the window in the sack and balls rolling around. Your Busted – But on Purpose.

You can then tell them how to make one of their own. Since I usually perform in churches, I use it early in my show to illustrate that there is no such thing as magic. I teach them the new word "illusions" and tell them everything they see me do is just a trick -- where I know something they don't.

Professor's Nightmare by Andy "Smiley" Anderson

When I started clowning this is one of the first magic tricks that I learned. It is such a simple but effective illusion. I have used it at everything from birthday parties to gospel shows. Once you learn how the trick works you can change the patter to meet your program.

Over the years I have had people tell me they have trouble with this After looking at the directions that come in the box I can see how this can be. So I'll go over the way I do this trick and see if it helps you.

There are three ropes of different lengths -small, medium and large. Remember this, if you loop the small around the large holding the one set of ends together and put the medium rope beside them, all three will be the same length. Now how do you get to this point?

Take the small rope and put it in your left hand so one end stands up and hold it with your thumb. Next put the middle rope beside the small one with the top even with the top of the small rope. Now put the large rope beside the middle one with all three top ends even and holding all three with your thumb. With the palm of your hand facing you, reach behind the middle and large ropes to grab the bottom

end of the small rope and bring it around the middle and large ropes then put the end between the top of the middle and large ropes. Next get the bottom of the middle rope put it beside the large rope. Then grab the bottom end of the large rope putting it beside the middle one being sure all six tops are even. As you are getting all the tops of the ropes even look at the loop the small rope makes and make sure it is about middle way up in your hand. The reason for this is to keep the loop from showing when you pull down on three of the ends. At this point I grab the last three tops on the right and pull right then down in one motion. You should have three ropes the same length. Pick the one rope by itself with your thumb and fingers of your right hand holding about where the loops of the other two ropes are and pull it to the side. Say "I have one rope", as you put this back in the other hand grab the other ropes by the loops pull and say "I have two ropes ". Then putting these back in your left hand and grab all three to say and show "I have three ropes the same length".

To add a little something to this trick, as you hold all the ropes in your left hand take the bottom end of the large rope put it between the last two top ends on the right. Next take the other two bottom ends one at a time and put on the right

side of the ropes. Have someone hold the three ends that are on the right as you pull the ropes through your hand. This will leave the person holding three ropes of different lengths.

Ambassador Of Clowning Award

Texas Clown Association (TCA) was founded in 1982 and the first TCA AMBASSADOR OF CLOWNING AWARD was presented in 1983. This award is to recognize and honor the TCA member who most exemplifies the art of clowning and supports and promotes TCA. The award is a "lifetime achievement award" meaning that a member is only honored once (in a lifetime) with this prestigious You might say "once an Ambassador always an Ambassador" and hopefully the recipients do continue to promote and support TCA and clowning long after being so named. But also, because it is only presented once in a lifetime, it takes more than a little bit of clowning and TCA support to earn this award. TCA Ambassador Award recipients are granted lifetime membership in TCA (meaning they no longer pay annual dues - at the TCA Board of Directors' The award is usually discretion). presented during the annual TCA convention but an Ambassador selection is not mandatory each year. Nominees should have the following qualifications and/or traits:

- Must be current and active member of TCA
- Must be known for his/her dedication and promotion of clowning without personal gain

- Should be well-rounded clown, i.e. someone who gives to the community, is an active volunteer, and who is exposed or is a professional in the art of clowning.
- Should promote TCA in all facets of clowning, and always strive to be positive, upbeat, agreeable and have a fair attitude. Be willing to share ideas and be available to assist with a smile.

Nomination letters should explain why the nominee should be considered for the award and provide examples of the points listed above - it is not enough to just say you want to nominate the person. The nominations are reviewed by a committee made up of past recipients of the award. Remember, that while most of the committee members are active in TCA, it is possible that they do not know every qualified member. Nominations should include sufficient details describing the nominee to the Committee members as if they do not know the nominee. Be sure to include such facts as:

- How long this the nominee been an active supporting TCA member?
- Have they held any positions in their alley or on the TCA board

or TCA committees?

- How do they support and promote TCA in their clowning?
- How have they exhibited extra-ordinary clownmanship?
- How has the nominee been shown to be positive, upbeat, agreeable and sharing? Are they unselfish in assisting others, caring and most of all, just there when needed with no thought of being reimbursed for their time or effort?
- How have they displayed being a well-rounded clown; someone who gives to the community as an active volunteer, and who also demonstrates professionalism in the art of clowning?
- How has this nominee shown his/her dedication and promotion of the art of clowning in assisting others?

Nominations will be accepted from CURRENT TCA members Nominees must be CURonly. RENT TCA members (to check membership status, contact the TCA Treasurer). Be sure to include your name and TCA number on your nomination letter as well as the REAL name and CLOWN name of your nominee. (Include your contact information too in case the committee has any questions about your nomination).

A list of the Ambassador Award recipients can be found on the TCA website. Remember, do not nominate any members who have already received the award.

The most recent recipient of the Ambassador Award serves as the Chair of the Ambassador Award Committee. (If that person is unavailable or declines to serve, a chair will be appointed by the TCA Board of Directors.) The Ambassador Committee Chair is responsible for submitting the nomination details and deadlines to The Joey Journal and collecting the nominations. Watch The Joey Journal for nomination information and deadlines. Nominations will be accepted by regular mail or e-mail. They must be dated or post-marked no later than the published deadline. Chair will validate each nomination received by the deadline (confirming the membership status of both the nominating member and their nominee).

The Ambassador Award Committee is made up of recent TCA Ambassador Award recipients who are still active in TCA (who have attended the TCA convention in the last three or four years) and who wish to participate in the commit-The Chair should contact the recent recipients to determine who will be participating in the committee. All qualified nominations received by the published deadline will be shared with all participating committee members. Committee participants who will not be attending the convention should submit their vote/selection to the Chair prior to the convention. The Chair must also notify the trophy provider at least two weeks prior to the convention regarding the need for a plaque (or not - in the case of no nominees - no award). Committee participants should plan to meet with the committee Chair immediately following the general membership meeting at the annual TCA convention to review the nominations and make a selection. Information in the nomination letters and any other pertinent known information by committee members

will be the criteria used in selecting the Ambassador Award recipient. In the event the committee cannot come to a conclusion, a TCA Board recommendation may be requested.

The selection is kept confidential until announced during the Awards Banquet at the TCA convention. The Ambassador Award Committee Chair is responsible for making the announcement and presenting the award.
