Proposed By-Law Change

The 2017-2018 Board is proposing the following changes to the current By-laws. The main change is to add a position to the current make-up of the Board of Directors. The Board feels that the work it takes to keep up with the data, that there should be a separate position and not saddle the Treasurer with this work. The new position will allow both the Treasurer and Membership Director to focus on their specific duties.

The Board will be bringing this to the General Membership at the Convention in August so please take the time to review this proposal.

Current TCA By-Law

ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2

• Numbers: The Board of Directors shall be composed of eleven (11) members. Those members shall be: President, Vice-president, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms, Immediate Past-President, and five (5) Area Directors.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

Section 2.

• Vice President: The Vice President shall assist the President as required, and in the absence of the President, preside over any duly noticed meeting. The Vice-President shall serve as the membership director and perform other duties as assigned by the President.

• Treasurer: The Treasurer shall keep an account of all monies received and expended for the use of the Corporation and shall make disbursements only upon vouchers approved by the Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee. He or she shall oversee the deposit of all sums received in a bank, or banks, or trust company approved by the Directors, and shall make a report for each noticed meeting of the Board of Directors and for the annual meeting. Funds may be drawn only upon the signature of the Treasurer or the President if the Treasurer is unavailable. The funds, books and vouchers in his or her hands shall at all times be under the supervision of the Board of Directors and subject to its inspection and control. At the expiration of his or her term of office, he or she shall deliver over to the successor all books, monies and other properties, or in the absence of a Treasurer-elect, to the President. In the case of absence or disability of the Treasurer, the Board of Directors may appoint a Treasurer pro tem. The Treasurer, or a designee, shall also be responsible for maintaining a roster of the active members and sending out membership cards.

Proposed TCA By-Law ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2

• Numbers: The Board of Directors shall be composed of twelve (12) members. Those members shall be: President, Vice-president, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Director, Sergeant-at-Arms, Immediate Past-President, and five (5) Area Directors.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS Section 2.

• Vice President: The Vice President shall assist the President as required, and in the absence of the President, preside over any duly noticed meeting. The Vice-President shall serve as the membership director and perform other duties as assigned by the President.

Section 4

• Treasurer: The Treasurer shall keep an account of all monies received and expended for the use of the Corporation and shall make disbursements only upon vouchers approved by the Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee. He or she shall oversee the deposit of all sums received in a bank, or banks, or trust company approved by the Directors, and shall make a report for each noticed meeting of the Board of Directors and for the annual meeting. Funds may be drawn only upon the signature of the Treasurer or the President if the Treasurer is unavailable. The funds, books and vouchers in his or her hands shall at all times be under the supervision of the Board of Directors and subject to its inspection and control. At the expiration of his or her term of office, he or she shall deliver over to the successor all books, monies and other properties, or in the absence of a Treasurer-elect, to the President. In the case of absence or disability of the Treasurer, the Board of Directors may appoint a Treasurer pro tem.' The Treasurer, or a designee, shall also be responsible for maintaining a roster of the active members and sending out membership cards. The Treasurer shall work with the Membership Director to ensure that the membership database is up to date.

Section 5

• Membership Director (New Board Position) The Membership Director shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the President and/or the Board of Directors. The Membership Director shall be responsible for the membership records and other membership duties as designated by the Board of Directors. The Membership Director shall be responsible for collecting membership dues and recording all membership data. The Membership Director shall assemble New Member information packets and distribute them to all new members. The Membership Director shall send out membership cards on an annual basis and put a renewal reminder in the Joey Journal. The Membership Director shall pass all funds on to the Treasurer in a timely and safeguarded manner, and all pertinent information on to the Newsletter Editor for mailing purposes and to the Website master for use in updating the membership roster on line. The Membership Director shall work with the Treasurer to insure a roster of the active members is maintained.

All remaining Sections in this article will be renumbered to accommodate the new position. No other changes are suggested for these sections.

You are in for a rare treat as our headliners for TCA 2018 include a mini Ringling Clown reunion featuring Dick Monday (Monday), Tiffany Riley (Slappy), Leon McBryde (Buttons), Kelly Ballagh (Kellogg), Julia Bothun (Cherry Mooseburger), Kelli (Brown) Ramazini, Julio (Furlan) Ramazini, Grainger Esch, Melodee Lenz.

Dick Monday (Monday)

Dick Monday was the Director of the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey's Clown College, where he trained and directed all the clowns for The Greatest Show on Earth. Dick's film and television credits include ABC's Into the Night with Rick Dees, Brain Donors, Saved by the Bell, The Late Show with David Letterman, The Tonight Show with Jay Leno, The Rosie O'Donnell Show and Woody Allen's Sweet and Lowdown. Dick has been a featured act with The Big Apple Circus, Circus Sarasota, Circo Atayde in Mexico, Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey, Lone Star Circus, the New York New York Hotel in Las Vegas and the Dallas Symphony Orchestra. He most recently wrote, directed, and performed in the Shanghai International Comedy Festival, directed two shows at The Dallas Children's Theater, and brought contemporary satire to an award-winning orchestra. He works with his wife and partner Tiffany Riley and together they are Slappy and Monday.

Tiffany Riley (Slappy)

Tiffany Riley or Slappy was the first female clown to be featured in The Big Apple Circus in NYC, and along with partner Dick Monday, has performed with the Lone Star Circus, Circus Sarasota, Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey, Hanneford Circus and Circo Atayde in Mexico. Most recently, she and Monday wrote, directed and headlined in the Shanghai Comedy Festival and ongoing in Goofballs Cabaret at the Pocket Sandwich theatre. After creating and growing the Funnyatrics Clown Program at Children's Medical Center, she launched the Laughter League Medical Clown Program at Cook Children's Medical Center, Boston Children's Hospital and Hasbro Children's Hospital. She holds a BFA in Acting from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts, and last May she completed her Master's Degree in Liberal Studies at Southern Methodist University.

Leon McBryde (Buttons)

Leon McBryde has led an exciting and unusual life doing everything from clowning with The Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus to being President of Fantasy Factory Ltd., the parent Corporation of ProKnows® and ProFace®. He was Good Will Ambassador for Ringling Bros. & Barnum & Bailey Circus, taught at Clown College, is an international performer and lecturer at multiple clown and entertainer conventions. He is the founder and director of Advanced Studies in the Performing Art of Clowning. He has created children's Christian television shows, written shows for Ronald McDonald, designed specialty motel rooms for Holiday Inn, and in 1990 was inducted into the Int'l Clown Hall of Fame. Leon semi-retired from clowning and donned the red suit 8 years ago. He took the same creativity and passion he had for clowning into the Santa world. As Santa Noel, Leon is a performance-based Santa and performs in the Miami Beach area in private homes and corporations. He also makes appearances at the prestigious Biltmore Hotel in Coral Gables and at the Atlantis, famed resort in the Bahamas. In 2017 he was inducted into the International Santa Claus Hall of Fame.

Kelly Ballagh (Kellogg)

Kelly started his career in clowning when he joined Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus in 2001. It was here that he spent his first years learning the art of clowning. In 2005, Kelly was promoted to the higher ranking of Boss Clown of the Red Unit, where he was placed in charge of the entire clown alley for the show. Instrumental in the hiring and training of new clowns, Kelly became a skilled teacher of the "art of performance clowning". After leaving the circus, Kelly moved to Texas where he still teaches clowning and performs around the world, both as a clown and comedic character. He can also be found lending his voice to Ralph the Dog, over in the CLZ Studios of COOK Children's in Fort Worth. Kelly has shared his talents at COAI, American Clown Academy, and TCA to name a few, and is proud to be back at TCA sharing his talents once more with all of us. Prior to joining Ringling Bros. and starting his clowning career, Kelly also traveled the United States with Puppet Productions Inc., teaching the art of puppetry to puppeteers around the country. Children are her greatest inspirations! She and her husband Julio are now a Clown Duo called The Ramazini's. They have performed many arenas nationwide and on national TV all across North America. Since leaving Ringling in 2013 Kelli and Julio have been performing and creating new shows. Kelli in an instructor at the Lonestar Circus School where she teaches aerial silks, lyra, trapeze, juggling and contortion.

Julio (Furlan) Ramazini

Julio Ramazini, is from Sao Paulo, Brazil. He attended circus school in Rio De Janiero for 4 years, where he was scouted out by a Ringling Bros affiliate who offered him a contract on the spot. In circus school, he studied many, many things, but preferred, juggling, stilt walking, unicycling, rolling globe, basing for canastilia, basing for perch, and trapeze. He has many physical skills, but his natural knack for comedy by far out rules everything. He and his wife Kelli (The Ramazini's) work together performing live and on TV all across the country. Julio teaches clowning, juggling, unicycling, rolling globe and silks at the Lonestar Circus School. Grainger Esch From a very young age, Grainger Esch (aka Professor Cacahuate, aka Dr. Quack) has been a dedicated pursuer of laughter. A graduate of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Clown College, he began his professional show business career as a clown with The Greatest Show on Earth. His experience there led to work as a featured clown with several other circuses, to performing as Stan Laurel at Universal Studios Hollywood theme park, and to work in television and film, including a role in Universal's How the Grinch Stole Christmas. He has worked as a comedy/variety performer in Mexico and Japan, played in a stilt-walking novelty band in California, and served as a volunteer firefighter in Salado, Texas. There, for ten years, he managed the Salado Silver Spur Theater (a live theatrical venue devoted to comedy, variety, and musical performance), and co-founded the Silver Spur Arts Academy. Currently he loves working as a therapeutic medical clown with the Laughter League at Cook Children's Medical Center in his hometown, Fort Worth.

Melodee Lenz

The stars must have aligned when Melodee Lenz stumbled into the world of the circus arts. Melodee had the great privilege to perform in the 139th Red Unit Clown Alley, touring with The Greatest Show on Earth, Ringling Bros. And Barnum & Bailey Circus. Melodee also worked as a medical clown for Children's Medical Center in Dallas as a member of the Funnyactrics Clown Care Program. Melodee has been a professional voice actress and comedy writer, actress, singer and dancer for as long as she can remember. I went to a Laugh Makers Conference in New York to learn the skills of the craft. Some I conquered quickly, some needed a lot more practice. But whatever I did, I enjoyed.

Thus began Poppins, The Clown, and her company Clown On The Run. In the years since, I started two children's clown clubs – one was for deaf children. When Ringling Bros. came to Dallas, I managed to have these children parade center ring at one performance of the circus. My little group also participated in many stage shows. It was wonderful to see these shy, inhibited children come alive and grow with confidence and self-esteem. The mayors of their cities would present them with an official Clown certificate for National Clown Day.

I also encourage some young clowns I taught to enter the TCA competitions. They were unbelievably talented. I am glad they now have a Child Clown section at convention.

The Texas Clown Association honored me in 1990 with the Texas Clown Association Ambassador Award, which I was so proud to receive.

My childhood was not a happy time, being brought up in an orphanage, but maybe I was supposed to be there so I would go on to make children happy. God does work in mysterious way.

"Resilience - Harnessing the Power of Humor" was the focus for the fourday conference. Judy "Peep" Cornett and Martha "Miss Cookie" Warren were the recipients of The Caring Clown Scholarships and Claudette "Miss Motzi" Webb received the Patty Wooten Nursing Scholarship. Kathy "Piccolo" Keaton presented a session on "Clowning During Crisis and Challenge." AATH is an educational leader in the pioneering field of humor therapy studies, presenting the latest studies and research to those interested in the positive health benefits of humor. Members incorporate humor into their profession and include scholars, psychologists, counselors, nurses, social workers, physicians, clergy, funeral directors, teachers, speakers and therapeutic clowns.

Humor Therapy is any intervention that promotes health and wellness by stimulating a playful discovery, expression or appreciation of the absurdity or incongruity of life's situations. This intervention to enhance health or be used as a complimentary treatment of illness to facilitate healing or coping, whether physical, emotional, social or spiritual.

"The stories I heard of resilience and the way people were able to bounce back after very challenging circumstances with the use of humor impressed me," said Martha. "I was excited to learn of all the studies, research and resources available to validate the importance of what we actually do as clowns." "Humor is really a much bigger deal than I thought" said TCA President Judy Cornett. I walked away with a clear understanding of the actual power of humor on our health. I took away new information and ideas I can use in my hospital work. Now I laugh on purpose while alone while in my car. It makes me just feel happier and makes me want to make others happy as well." Claudette Webb said, "It opened my eyes to how valuable what we do really is. It will now make me stop and think a little more about how we can really affect people in a positive way, especially adults and not just children. The conference helped me begin to look for signs of when I can use humor and apply it appropriately even when not clowning."

"As a twenty-year member of AATH and passionate about sharing the health and wellness part of humor and laughter with others, I was excited to have other Texas clowns be able to attend the conference. Understanding the true value and health benefits of humor and laughter has helped give me confidence as a clown and speaker and also helped my credibility as a professional in my field as a therapeutic clown and certified humor professional. What we do is important. Clowns matter!"

Member Spotlight: Earl Warren by Jeanette "Dusti" Sanders

Earl is the first to volunteer for any Happi Tymes charity events such as Arlington's Fall Fest, providing his own tent and setting it up at the three day event for the past 15 years. He has been officially recognized by the alley for his volunteer activities. Earl, along with two other alley clowns planned and organized an annual citywide event for Arlington at risk children which lasted five consecutive years. As many as 130-200 children each year were treated with games, food and clown entertainment for four hours. Along with the other organizers, he built a half dozen large games for the events and stored them each year at his home. He coordinated the event for a five years, using his time to do the publicity, much of the food solicitation and publicity calls at churches, low income organizations and news organizations. This three man team also organized and produced the first annual Joint Entertainers Meeting in the Metroplex in 2004, Designed to be hosted every third year by a different alley to bring ALL area entertainers together to socialize and get to know

each other. The hope was to break down the "wall" between some of the groups, primarily magicians and clowns; to know clowns as a legitimate entertainer rather than someone who "violates-the magicians oath." Since the other organizers have long since dropped out of clowning, Earl has been the driving force, along with Happi Tymes board, in keeping this event rotating.

Earl created and is administrator of Happi Tymes website without reward and has created and maintains two other clown sites. During the early years of the alley he wrote and published our monthly newsletter, which was through the U.S. Mail.

Earl has been coordinator for the alley for a local 4th July parade for at least 15 years, and volunteer float builder for the years the city required Happi Tymes to enter a float to participate. Earl is an August clown, entertains as characters: Birthday parties as Professor Moon the Harry Potter teacher; Billy Whiskers the twister and cowboy clown; Professor Apple-hill the Egypt explorer and "dirt doctor" and appears as a Patriotic clown. He has 30 years of entertaining as Santa throughout the DFW Metroplex, which includes volunteering for visits to charity events. He has been a member of the planning and administrative team for at least 5+ TCA conventions, including the first Summer convention sponsored by Happi Tymes where he was the coordinator. As a clown he has attended and participated in competitions for numerous conventions through the years.

Earl is a member of all three alleys in the Metroplex and participates in charity events and fund raising events for Cowtown and Mid-Cities, donating his time and inventory. Earl continually encourages _clowns in Happi Tymes and outside to learn and participate in as many clown activities as possible to become better, and more self-confident in their craft. He is willing to take time with any clown that wants to team new skills. He has frequently built walk around items or pocket magic items as handouts to Happi Tymes members.

He served as Happi Tymes Treasurer for 10 years and has been President of Happi Tymes at least 3 times and currently holds that office. At each meeting he urges everyone to be a TCA member and encourages members of the other COAi local alleys to also join or renew and to attend conventions.

At 84 years of age, Earl is still a driving force in clowning locally and through TCA.
