Having Something to Share

When there's an opportunity for clowns to do Career Day presentations at elementary schools it's always an excellent way to educate young children about clowns and clowning in a positive and safe environment. However, we should prepare ourselves for the reactions we'll get from our fellow presenters. I do Career Day presentations on a regular basis, my audiences are Kindergarteners thru 2nd grade. I arrive at the school feeling grateful for this opportunity and filled with an inner peace that's so important in order to connect with the children and share with them Bebop's passion and profession. These Career Day presentations allow me to introduce the "Art of Clowning" to a young audience in an academic setting. I make certain that my presentation is educational, informative and entertaining. The school's goal is to bring professionals from within the community to share with the children pertinent information regarding their professions.



This is how a Career Day event usually unfolds; all presenters meet in the Library at 8am and are given a schedule of the morning sessions. We're then taken to individual rooms where we'll each be making our presentations as classes rotate from room to room. I do my Career Day presentations in-full-clown, so Bebop is mingling with fellow presenters who may be; college professors, accountants, local news personalities, bankers, insurance agents, etc.....What I prepare myself for are the comments, questions and definitely looks that I'll get from these individuals. I won't go into them specifically because I know, if you've been clowning for any number of years, you can imagine the experience. Suffice to say most comments, questions and definitely the looks could be considered less than kind and unprofessional.

I know that clowning might not be at the top of every parent's list of professions for their child but for today's event their young child will have fun and be introduced to something special; the world of clowning. When the children first see me I capture their interest and attention. They know that a 'Real Clown' is going to talk directly to them and share information about clowning and they're ready to listen and I am ready to share.

- I share energy and enthusiasm to learn and give them a reason to read.
- I share comedy routines that give them a reason to laugh.
- I share magic routines that give them a sense of wonder.
- I share juggling techniques giving them something to strive for.
- I share what passion looks like and what passion sounds like so they can have dreams and follow their hearts.

In return I get smiles, giggles, high-fives and hugs; they now know that not all clowns are scary. At the end of the sessions my fellow presenters and I gather in the Library to pick-up our certificates of appreciation from the Librarian. I know some of them are still wondering why I'm there but too tired to bother with the thought. As for me, I leave feeling the same way I arrived; grateful, peaceful and satisfied. I've shared a little bit of Bebop's world with some great kids; I've shared the "Art of Clowning".

Hidden Talent

There was plenty of hard work to do too: baling hay, cutting tobacco, hanging tobacco in the barn, hoeing corn, etc. There was no end in sight for this farm girl! Thankfully, Sundays were a day of rest. We kids would play soft ball, badminton, and cowboys and Indians in the front yard. One Saturday, while playing, I picked up a blade of grass and put it between my thumbs. I put it up to my mouth to see if I could make a whistle sound or something similar. I blew on the blade of grass, and to my surprise and delight, out came the sound of a train whistle!

Over the years, it's been loads of fun to call up the old whistle anytime I want, especially when entertaining kids. They find it amusing, and will try to mimic me! Most of the time, I will curl both hands, and place them around my mouth, as if I'm getting ready to holler. This is only a guise that adds to the mystery! Do you have a hidden talent--something you can put to work in a show?

I made a rectangular prop from white cardboard some years ago. In the middle, there's a circular cut-out. Around the cut-out, I placed colorful images of trains, including a few smiling ones. It was a simple, but fun prop. I would poke my "mug", my face, up to the cut-out, and would start my engine, if you will. Oh, the stories you can tell! The train whistle is a gift from God, and one I don't take for granted.



Keys to a better Show #5 - The Quick Trick Script By Norman Barnhart

You will make your new trick better, much faster, if you write a short script to go with it. When you memorize the script it will be just like being in a play or TV show. Magicians are actors and the script is very important to making what you say sound good. Simply, write 4 or 5 numbers on a sheet of paper. Then think about what the trick is about, and write a script in steps.

For example: Zambini Shuffle Trick by Norm Barnhart

#1 Would you please take a card?

#2 Look at your card and memorize it.

#3 Please place it back in the pack

#4 I will now drop the cards into the bag and do the great Zambini shuffle, I learned this last summer on my trip to wonderful far away land of exotic ... Iowa.

#5 Shake the bag while jumping around in a crazy manner. Announce – "this Zambini Shuffle will thoroughly mix the cards like no other shuffle."

#6 Then stick your head into the bag and come back out with the selected card seen between your teeth. #7 "My dentist loves this trick."

#8 Hold up the card and take a bow.

If you want to see this trick in performed live, look for my upcoming video. Basically there is a small brown paper pocket taped on the inside of the large paper bag. This holds a duplicate card, to the one forced at the beginning of the trick. But for now, let's see how a script helps.

You have the five sentences you will say all written out so you can memorize them. Then as you go you may think of another joke to add, just write it on the card and you will be able to practice until you really have it down pat. If you do not memorize then you will be fishing for things to say during the show and that is embarrassing magic. However once you have a script, you can add jokes during the show as they come up.

Review and improve your script. If a joke does not get a laugh then try saying it a different way or timing it differently. If the joke still does not get a good reaction – drop it and replace with something else until you find the right line to go for that moment.

Once you have a good script you can improvise and adapt to the audience you are in front of. The basic script gives you something to start from in your performance. It also keeps you from forgetting an important details in the trick.
