





- 2. The other two years we can have a one- or two-day Family Reunion in a centralized place such as Austin or surrounding areas of Austin. This would be hosted by the TCA. We would have a general meeting and a few educational workshops and maybe a special picnic and show. Get your thinking caps on. Thank you for your thoughts. I can't wait to hear what you have to say when we meet again.

WE have a variety of vendors from balloons, t-shirts, educational books, costumes, etc. There are some great raffle items, along with the silent auction.


So "Buzzzz" on in to the convention and have a good time. Hope to see to see you there!! Until then "BEE" safe whatever you do!!

Hank Morrow - Denton Clowns on Fire






